## HALTON LIFE CHAIN 2020

"Please join us for our 32nd annual Life Chain on Sunday, Oct. 4th, 2020. This is a peaceful, prayerful, silent pro-life witness for the unborn in our community. Join thousands of pro-lifers across North America as we make a one-hour visual statement of solidarity to end abortion and honour the lives of over 54 million children lost to abortion. Stand for those without a voice!

Due to the recent outdoor restrictions related to COVID 19, we can only have 25 people assembled outdoors at one time. There is little chance of the virus spreading since we will be separated and silent during the hour. The only time we are together is to pick up and drop off signs.

We will place the signs on the ground 8 feet apart with a weight on them before the event begins at 2:30pm. We will do this where the participant is designated to stand. Then when participants leave, they can place them down in the same place to be picked up afterwards.
