**PASTORAL LETTER FROM
BISHOP DOUGLAS CROSBY**

Solemnity of St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Dear Friends,

On the feast day of St. Joseph, we are given the perfect opportunity to reflect on our mission at St. Joseph's Health System: *Living the Legacy: Compassionate Care. Faith.
